Dear Parent

In order to ensure the safety of pupils we are continuing with the measures which we have in place to help create a safe environment. In doing so, we hope that the risk of transmission of infection is significantly reduced. We ask that all parents respect these measures and children to follow the procedures and expectations carefully. Please do not send your child to school if:

- 1. He/she has a high temperature (37.8C or above) a new/continuous cough; or a loss/change in sense of smell/taste
- 2. He/she or any member of the household has tested positive for Covid-19
- 3. He/she or any member of the household is displaying any symptoms of Covid-19
- 4. He/she has been told is isolate by NHS Test and Trace, the NHS Covid App or by school/another organisation and are still within the isolation period

Please ensure you and your child/children adhere to the Health Protection (Coronavirus, International Travel) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020 and he/she has self-isolated in one place for 14 days if he/she has returned from a country which is not on the UK exempt list.

Please inform Mrs Doherty immediately if you are notified of a positive test in your household.

- Pupils will follow social distancing and hand hygiene as in Term1.
- Pupils P1-P3 should enter the school grounds following the yellow footsteps.
- P4-P7 Key Worker pupils should enter and exit following the red footsteps.
- Pupils should only bring necessary items to school.
- Parents should not congregate in groups in areas immediately outside the school.
- Parents must not enter the school buildings, unless in very exceptional circumstances.
- All visitors must wear a mask and sanitise their hands on entering the school building.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING

Pupils in P1, P2 and P3 will return to school on **Monday 8th March** for two weeks, P4-P7 will continue to receive remote learning until the end of term, with no change to method or format.

On Monday 8th March P1-P3 pupils should arrive as follows:

Mrs Patrick's P3 9.00am Mrs Allen 9.05am Mrs Woods 9.10am

Pick up times will be:

Mrs Woods 1.50pm Mrs Allen 1.55pm Mrs Patrick's P3 2.00pm

From Monday 8 March onwards P1-P3 children should;

- 1. Wear school uniform Monday-Thursday and Fit Friday clothes each Friday.
- 2. Bring a packed lunch, a break time snack and a filled water bottle.
- 3. Bring their plastic reading book bag, with their sanitised reading books enclosed along with school text books and jotters.
- 4. Bring their replenished plastic box of stationery etc. as required by class teacher in Term 1,
- ~ Replacement plastic school bags are still available for 50p.
- ~ Any parent wishing to send hand sanitizer with their child should do so.
- ~ Mrs Patrick's Primary 3 please bring your reading books, textbooks and jotters.

Key Worker children who are in school from week beginning Monday 8th March start at 9am and finish at 2pm each day. They should enter and exit the school grounds by following the footsteps.

All classes P1-P7 will have remote learning week beginning Monday 22 March – Friday 26 March, followed by a two week Easter break.

We must ask that at arrival and departure times you remain at the school gate for as brief a time as possible, wear a face mask and adhere to the social distancing rules.

	For Literacy work you will need an inky pen (not a biro). These are available in all supermarkets
	and newsagents.
